The Clinic

The clinic, will offer interaction with top horsemen and a demonstration of their techniques for handling weanlings and yearlings under stressful conditions, saddling and starting unbroken yearlings, and introducing horses to trailers and to the starting gate *with safety for both humans and the horse always in mind.*

The Horsemen

Craig Cameron, has handled thousands of horses and conducts 40 or more clinics a year. His clients include working ranches, fairs, nationally recognized equine expositions and he regularly appears on RFD TV. In addition has worked horses for individuals like Bob Moorhouse, at the Pitchfork Ranch, country artist Michael Martin Murphy, and seven-time PRCA All-Around Cowboy, Ty Murray.

Bob Duncan, for 25 years the starter at NYRA tracks is recognized nationally because of his efforts to understand and help horses at the starting gate. Bob is now a consultant to trainers at Saratoga and elsewhere, including starting horses for Todd Pletcher at his Florida training center.

John Maxwell and Ross Lindeman, lifelong Australian horsemen, have spent the past three summers working with the employees and sale yearlings at Three Chimneys, Lane’s End and Hermitage farms, and at the September sale.

Dr. Les Bruer, on the faculty of Texas A&M for 10 years, headed the equine research program at Purina for 30 years, and is now an equine nutritional consultant. Because a horse’s welfare begins with nutrition, at lunch, he will discuss nutritional myths.

Horsemen from Kentucky are recognized worldwide for their skills but the best know that school is never out for the professional. This third clinic is in response to requests from farm managers, trainers, assistant starters, outriders and other horsemen, plus an increased interest in the welfare and safety of the horse. If you or your employees work daily with horses, all will benefit from the new ideas demonstrated and the reinforcement of your own experience.
