- We believe the record will indicate that more progress has been made during the past two years in these areas of our sport than in any other comparable time period in history. For example, we have seen:



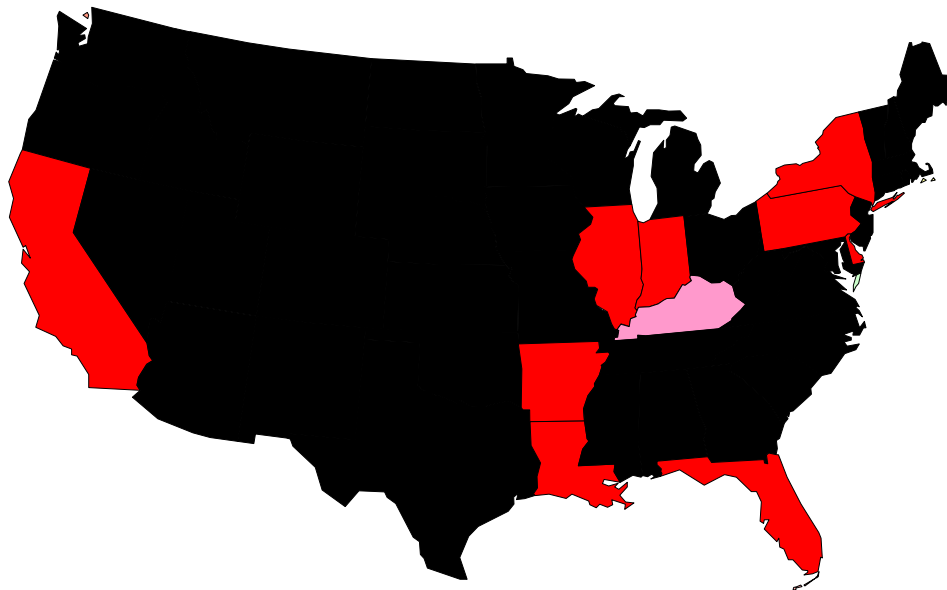
- Elimination of steroids
- Establishment of a national racetrack accreditation program
- Establishment of the Equine Injury Database
- Establishment of the Racing Surfaces Testing Lab
- Establishment of the Drug Testing Initiative
- Creation of model legislation to introduce the Interstate Racing Regulatory Compact
- Establishment with Keeneland Association of the Jockey Health Information
- Widespread adoption of specific equipment rules to enhance safety of riders and horses
- Continued enforcement of The Jockey Club rules that deny privileges of *The American Stud Book* to anyone who commits an act of cruelty to a Thoroughbred



Steroids

Results from 10 State Survey of Rule Books

- Model rule language adopted by commission
- Similar rule in place



Note: the anabolic steroid model rule was passed by RCI in December 2008.

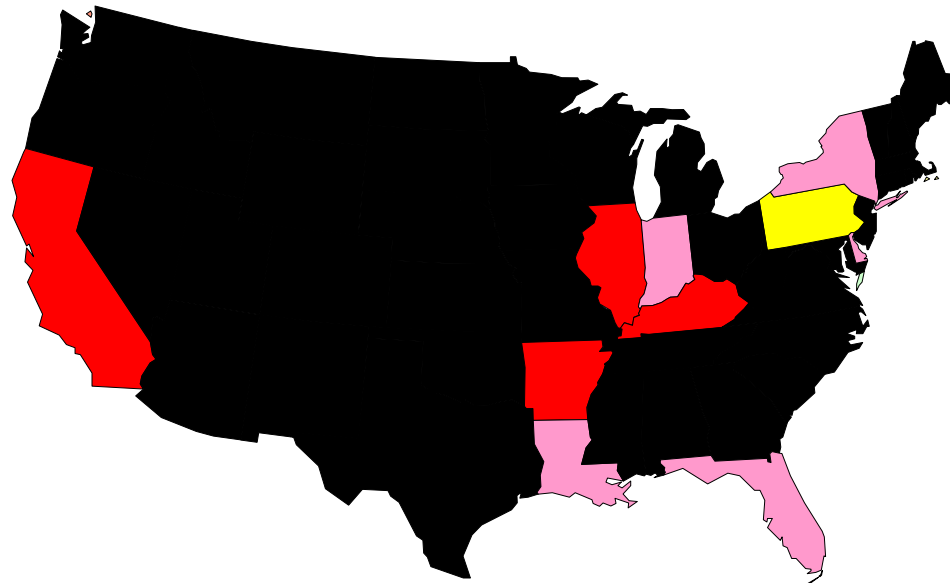
- Kentucky does not permit stanozolol to be present in the post race test



Alkalinizing Substances

Results from 10 State Survey of Rule Books

- Model rule language adopted by commission
- Similar rule in place giving horse on Lasix a different threshold
- Testing will begin on July 15, 2010



Note: the TCO₂ model rule was passed by RCI in April 2009.

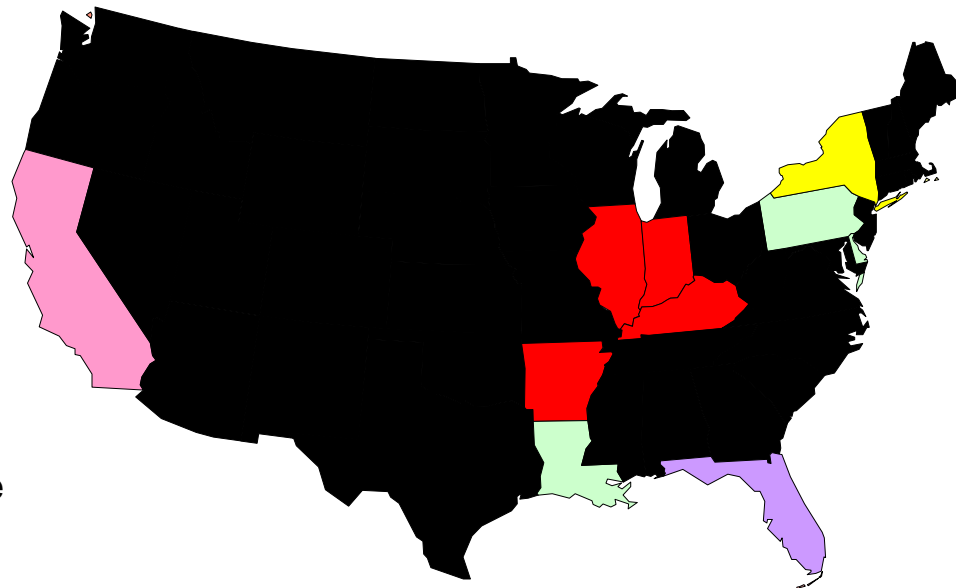
- Louisiana uses 36 millimoles per liter threshold compared to the Model Rule recommended 37 millimoles per liter
- Indiana uses 36 millimoles per liter threshold for non lasix horses and 38 millimoles per liter threshold for horses administered lasix



NSAID

Results from 10 State Survey of Rule Books

- Model rule language adopted by commission
- Similar rule with different flunixin threshold
- Rule only allows bute
- Rule only states a bute threshold at the 5 micrograms
- Rule only allows one of two, either bute or flunixin, at 24 hours and no thresholds



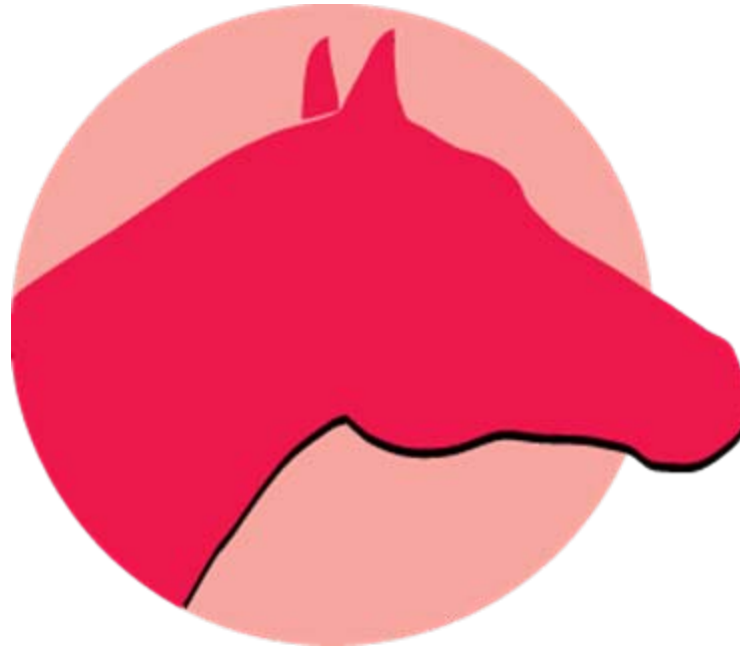

NSAID

Note: the NSAID model rule was passed by RCI in 2005.

- California has a 50 nanogram threshold for Flunixin, the Model Rule contains a 20 nanogram threshold
- Delaware only allows bute at a 2.5 microgram threshold the model rule allows for a single dose of any of the approved three NSAID with a bute threshold of 5 micrograms
- Pennsylvania only allows bute at a 2 microgram threshold the model rule allows for a single dose of any of the approved three NSAID with a bute threshold of 5 micrograms
- Louisiana only allows bute at a 5 microgram threshold the model rule allows for a single dose of any of the approved three NSAID
- Florida only contains a 5 microgram threshold for bute but does not state the other non-steroidal anti-inflammatory are not permitted
- New York does not allow Ketoprofen and does not list a threshold for the two allowed NSAID
