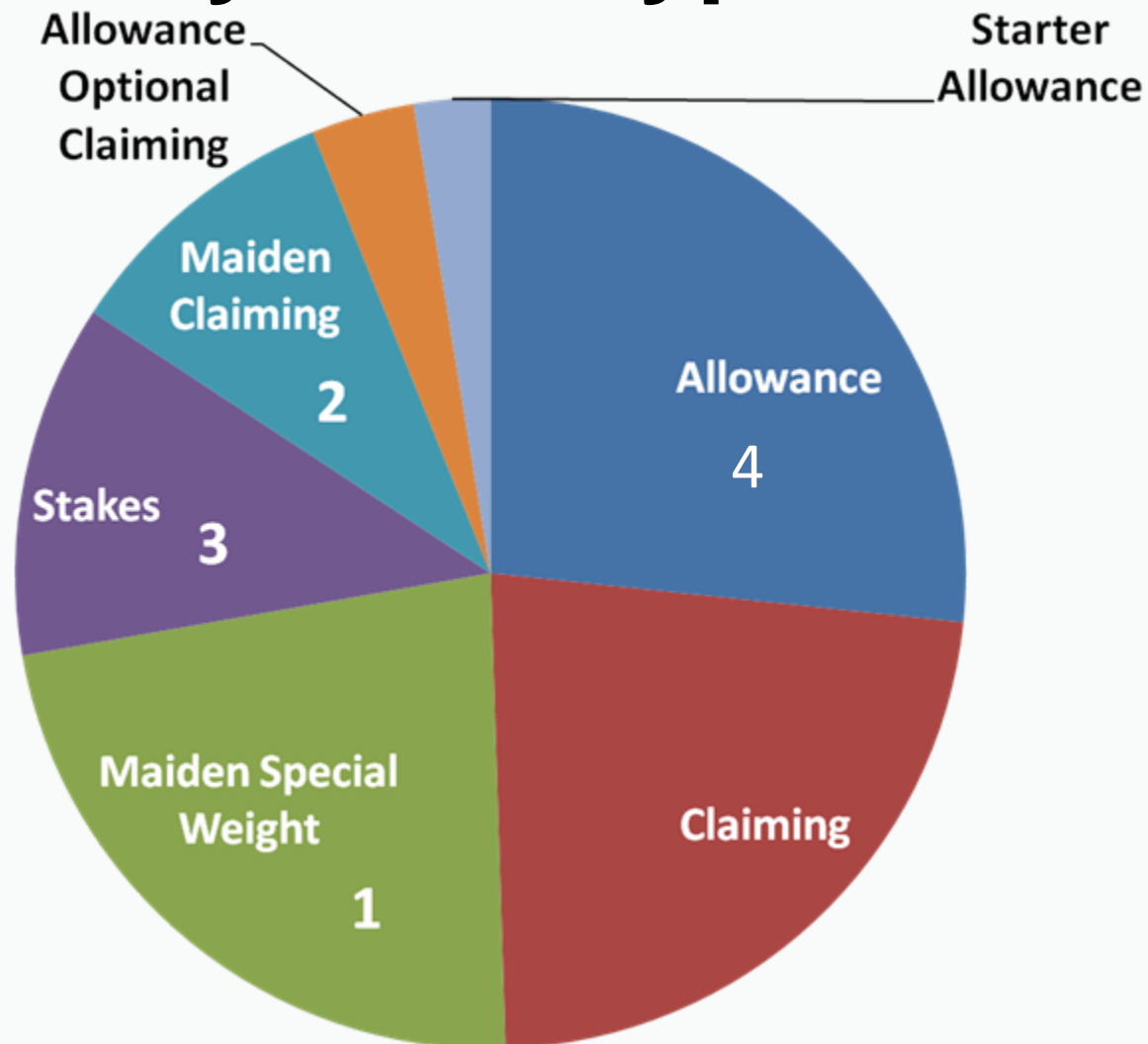
- It is about making it safer for the horse and rider, whatever the surface
- No single solution



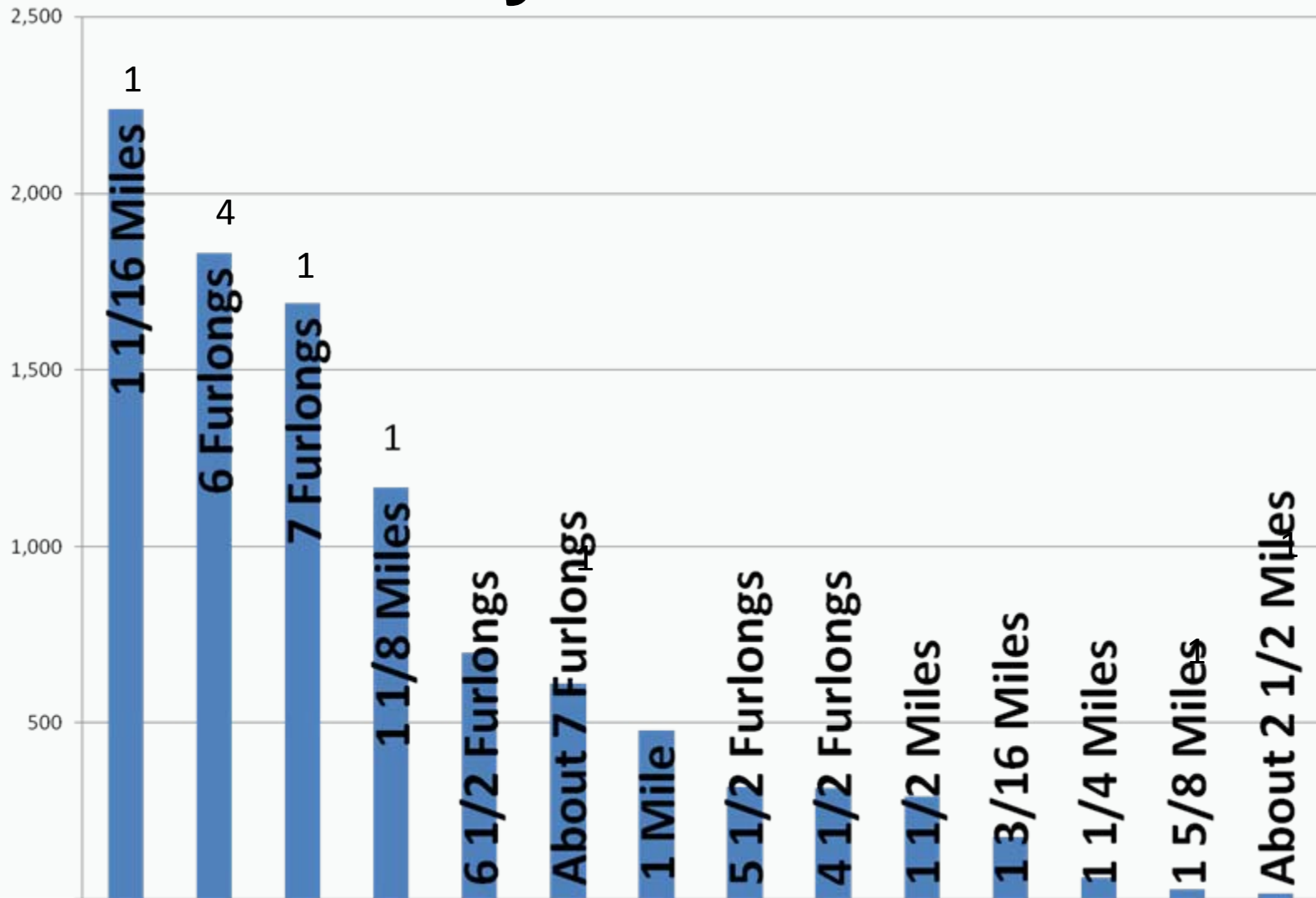

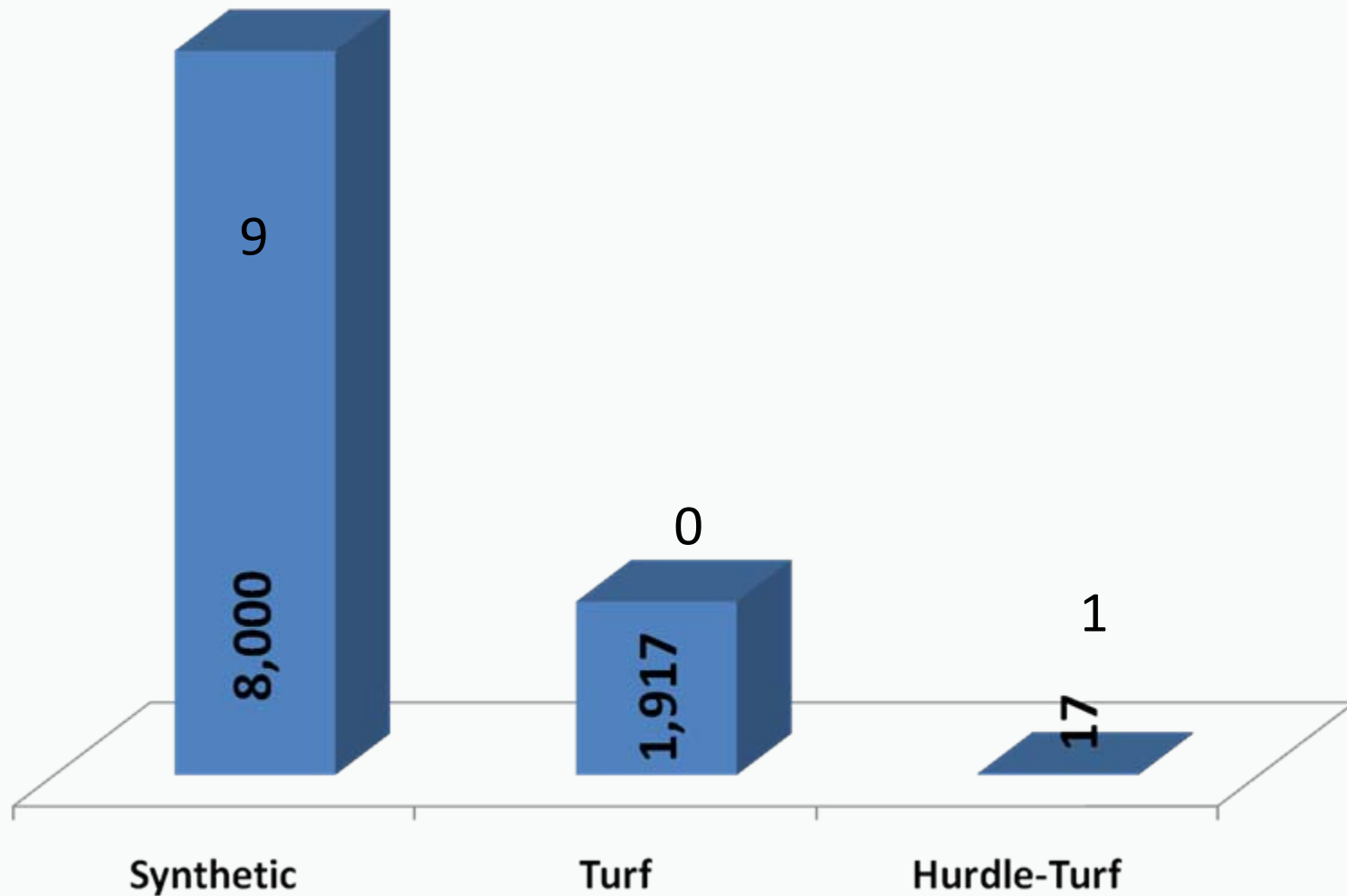
By Race Type

Average # of Fatalities Per 1000 Starts

10 fatalities/9934 starts = 1.01

Keeneland Stats

Since October 2006, Polytrack Only

10 fatalities/9662 starts = 1.03
