- October 2006
 - Proposal for injury tracking system at WSS
- January 2007
 - Pilot project, regulatory vets volunteer
- July 2008
 - The Jockey Club official launch, online reporting
- November 2008
 - 73 tracks participating; data quality controlled
- November 2009
 - 12 months quality controlled data acquired

2010

- As of June 7, 2010
 - 86 racetracks participating
 - 86% of all flat racing starts in North America represented
 - 100% of steeplechase and timber starts
 - Over 19,500 total reports submitted since the pilot project inception
