Responsibilities Include:

- Track Safety, Testing and Baseline Database Entry
- Equipment Compliance (Crops, Vests, Helmets, Rail Specs)
- Graded Stakes Security
- Accident & Fatality Investigations, Necropsy Reviews
- Monitoring of Race Day Restrictions
- CHRB Investigator and EMD Assistance (may include SA video)
- Special Projects (3rd Party Lasix; Microchip Program; Emergency Response)



Identifying Horses-at-Risk

Horses that:

- Are Maiden 4YO non-starters
- Have not started in 120+ days
- Have been eased or on:
 - ☐ Stewards' List for Poor Performance
 - ☐ Vet's List
- Have otherwise been identified due to:
 - □ Racing or training pattern
 - □ Observation by Veterinarians or Clockers



Examining Horses-at-Risk

At-Risk InCompass Report

- At-Risk characteristics are correlated with In/Out slips provided by Racing Office, workout tabs and PPs
- Approximately 15-25% of horse population meets criteria
- Team includes:
 - State (2 or 3) and Track Veterinarians (2) and staff
 - Racing Office
 - Safety Stewards
- Exams are also conducted on dark days
- Horses may be placed on Vet's List, subjected to additional exams or, sometimes, required to have scans.



Benefits of At-Risk Program

Since Inception of At-Risk Program at Del Mar in July 2017

- Increased awareness of at-risk horses for:
 - □ Trainers
 - □ Racing Office (may refuse entry)
- Fewer Fatalities (racing and training):
 - **□ 35% reduction Fiscal YTD 16-17 vs. 17-18**
 - ☐ Calendar YTD in CA lowest in 11 years
