


The 2019 allouent of 81,338,858 will find eight mee projects at seven universities, ontimuing projects, and three career development awards.

The 2019 slate of research brings Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation's totals since 1983 to more than \$27.5 million to underwrite 366 projects at 44 universities.

In March of 2015, a special call for research on exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage was issued by the Grsyon-Jocky (tub Research Foundation. Emphasis was placed on strategies to control EIPH without rac-day medication. Two projects were selected. The premise of the research was to look at the post-treatment effect of furusemide (Salix, or Lasix) if it had been given 24 hours before exercise with water intake limited to maintenance water levels (which are known). are known).

One project submitted by the University of California at Davis One project submitted by the University of Lalibrana at Luws; under the direction O Dr. Heather Knych proposed to take 15 für Thoroughbreds with no known history of bleeding and assess three treatments head-to-head against each other; saline placebo, furosemide four hours before exercise, and furosemide 24 hours before exercise with limited water access. The results showed with 24-hour administration the The results showed with 24-hour administration the pharmacologic level of furosemide is approximately 1×100th the level of circulating medication when compared to four-hour pre-exercise administration. So, more than 99% of the medication has cleared by 24 hours.

In the horses with no known bleeding history, there was one bleeder. He bled with no treatment, and he bled through both treatments, though the four-hour furosemide treatment reduced his grade of bleeding. There were three endoscopic graders and blood in the trachea was seen in 11 of the 43 endoscopic exams; on four exams was the blood more than a grade 1 (trace) and three of those four observations were accounted for by the one horse that bled continuously



So the conclusion from the study was that, though blood was seen on the endoscopic exam of 11 of 43 endoscopic exams, the four-hour furosemide reduced the number of times blood was observed compared to the 24-hour treatment, and the BAL
